Safety

Our Clubs are in the middle of a three-year project to improve the physical space at all of our Club sites by adding safety features and upgrading places where our children play and learn.

Social Connection

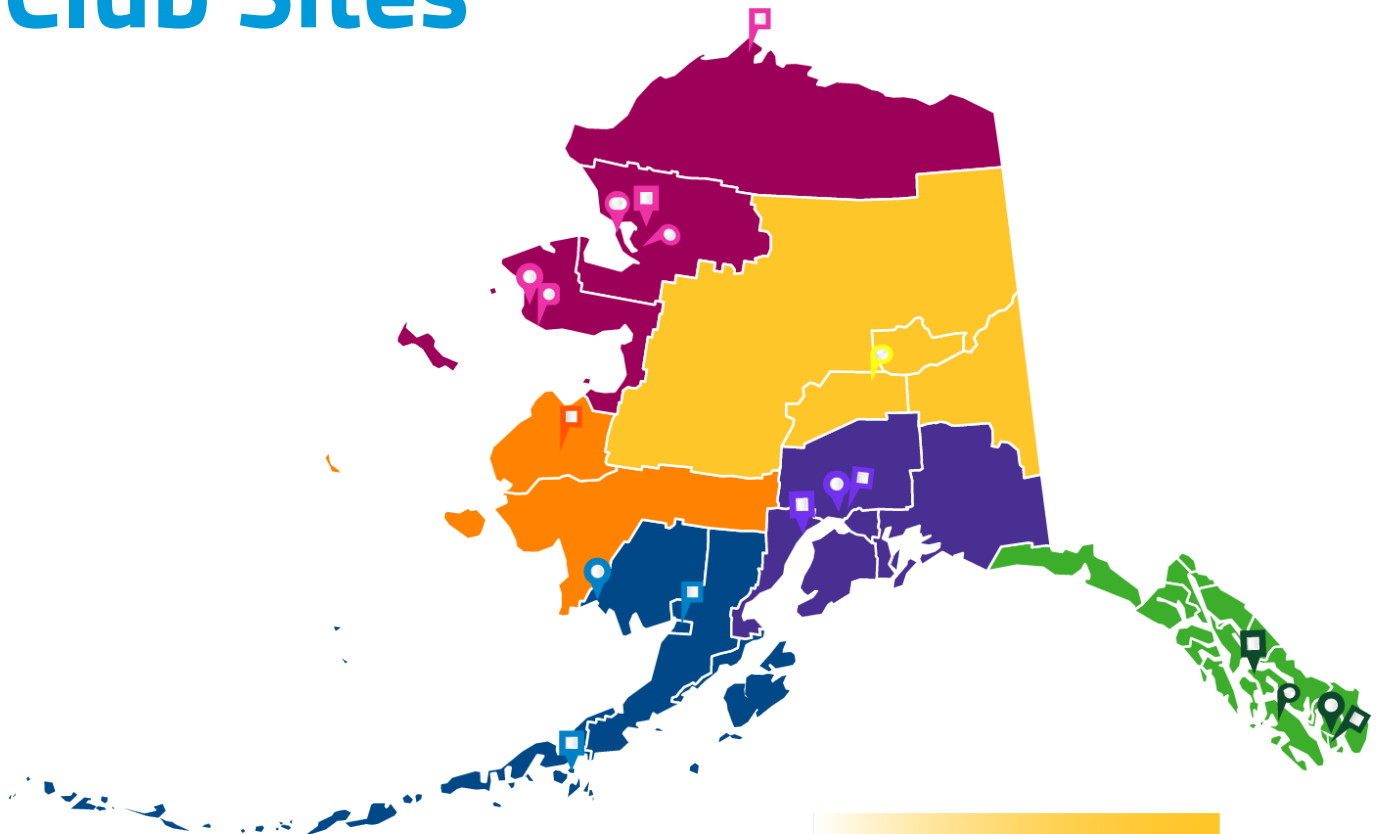
Children and youth have been very vocal about how they miss

opportunities to connect with friends throughout the pandemic. When schools were closed, Clubs facilities were open whenever possible. Where local health mandates limited the number of youth who could attend Clubs, the Clubs reached out to families and children in the community virtually. When it was not possible to reach children personally, the Clubs secured materials and volunteers to build and distribute activity kits to keep them engaged and to know they are not alone.

Service

The Clubs are connected to the community. Delivering hot meals to children and families who need them, hosting space for children to connect to virtual schooling, providing childcare for working families, and just being there when we're needed is what the Clubs do.

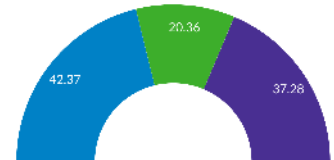

For 60 years, Boys & Girls Clubs - Alaska has changed and saved young lives during the time spent outside of school. We want every child to be in a safe, constructive environment when they are not at home or in school. We provide a safe place for nearly 4,000 youth in 20 communities across Alaska.

Throughout 2021, Clubs served an average of 462 youth every day

Priority Outcome Program Areas

Clubs provide positive programs that foster three priority outcomes in members: Academic Success, Healthy Lifestyles, and Good Character & Leadership.

In 2021, Clubs implemented 11,068 hours of programming in our targeted outcome areas.

World Class Club Experience

Staff work hard each day to provide members with high quality programs. We believe every child deserves the opportunity to pursue academic success and create meaningful relationships in a safe FUN environment!



86% of members report having strong adult connections at the Club.

Boys & Girls Clubs - Alaska takes part in an annual survey which tracks the wellbeing of members nationally, across all Boys & Girls Clubs. The survey asks how youth feel about the activities and time spent at the Club, plans for future education, involvement in their community, and work.

Additionally, the survey asks about the attitudes and health behaviors of Club members, including questions about nutrition and physical activity.

83% of members believe the Club provides a safe, supportive environment.

The questions aim to measure how Club members feel regarding their emotional safety, physical safety, fun, sense of belonging, adult connections, staff expectations and recognition. Each of these measures align with one of the five key elements for positive youth development.



83% of members believe the Club is FUN!

Providing a safe, positive environment, creating fun and a sense of belonging, building supportive relationships, setting high expectations and providing new opportunities, as well as, providing formal and informal recognition are those five key elements.

Looking toward the future...

We continuously improve Clubhouse, Athletic, and Childcare programs in response to changing community needs.

In the fall of 2021, sports such as indoor soccer (futsal) were temporarily put on pause. Registration will once again be open for futsal in the spring of 2022. Registration will also open for spring basketball and volleyball with an expectation that our strong numbers from the winter sports season will carry over.

Summer will see the addition of a cheerleading program to accompany our flag football and outdoor soccer programs.

The BGC - Alaska Athletic Staff is working diligently to ensure that numbers continue to increase following a decline in participation due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

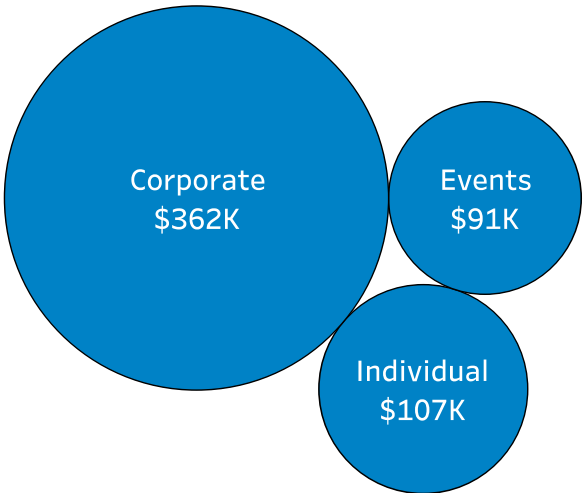

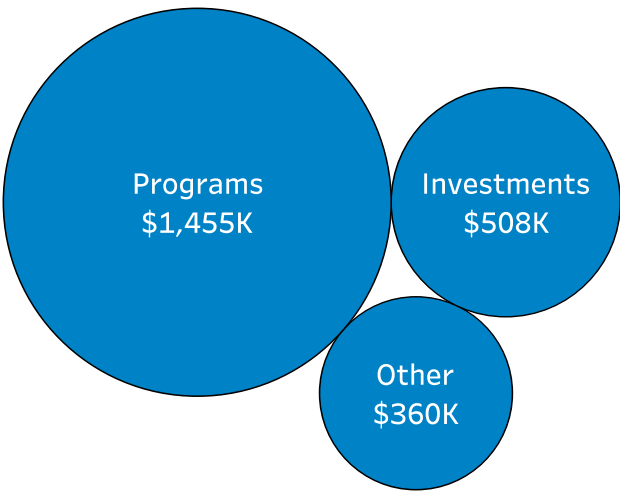
Grants, Awards, and Government Funds



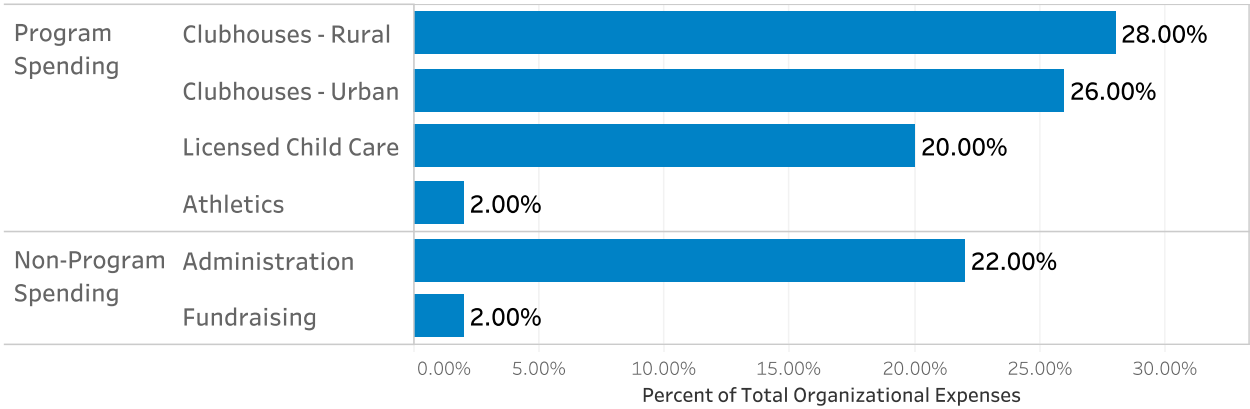
Fundraising

Volunteers

A total of 492 volunteers served Boys & Girls Clubs - Alaska through completing 23,424 hours of volunteer service. With an estimated value of \$28.54 per hour, that comes out to \$668,521 worth of contributed time, talent, and effort!



Clubhouse Programs

252 volunteers completed 5,779 hours serving youth directly statewide in Clubhouses, remotely via virtual programs, or assisting with the distribution of activity kits and/or meals.



Athletic Programs

212 volunteers completed 17,500 hours serving youth as mentors and coaches for basketball, soccer, and volleyball programs.



Volunteer Groups

28 volunteers joined corporate and community groups to complete 145 hours serving youth and the organization through Clubhouse programming like assisting during field days or during non-program hours through Clubhouse beautification projects.

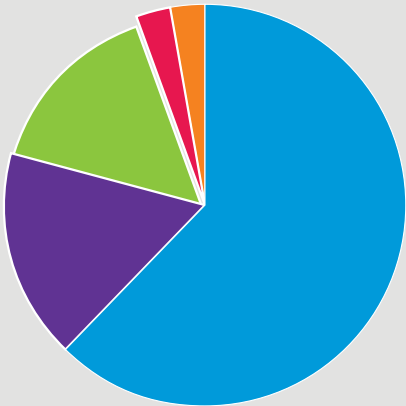
